CONCEPT NOTE



1. Background

Established in 1996 the Ocean Road Cancer Institute (ORCI) has served as Tanzania's national referral center for cancer care. Over the past three decades, ORCI has played a pivotal role in delivering comprehensive oncology services, including radiotherapy, chemotherapy, surgical oncology, nuclear medicine, cancer screening, research, training, and palliative care.

As ORCI celebrates its 30th anniversary, the institute will host a high-level international Oncology Conference to reflect on its journey, highlighting achievements, and chart a way forward for cancer control in Tanzania and the region.

The anniversary event and the international oncology conference is scheduled to take place on 12th to 13th February,2026 at Julius Nyerere convention Centre (JINCC), Dar es salaam, Tanzania

The event will bring together key stakeholders, including clinicians, researchers, policymakers, development partners, cancer survivors, and civil

society, to foster dialogue and promote evidencebased cancer care.

Over 600 participants from more than 20 countries are expected to attend, including representatives from international cancer institutes, public health experts, NGOs, academic institutions, and the private sector.

2. Objectives

The primary objectives of the event are:

- i. Honor and Recognize Contributors: Celebrate and recognize staff, cancer survivors, donors, and strategic partners who have contributed to ORCI's mission and progress.
- ii. Raise Awareness and Educate: Raise public awareness about cancer prevention, early detection, and available treatment services.
- iii. Mobilize Funding: Attract funding and investment for cancer infrastructure development, particularly for the acquisition of advanced radiotherapy equipment. As well as to improve access to cervical cancer screening and treatment for women living in rural areas through outreach services and community-based health initiatives. Also for reaching and serving vulnerable populations, with a special focus on individuals living with albinism and those affected by cancer.
- Stakeholders: iv. Engage Foster multi-sectoral collaboration amona government, private sector, academia, and civil society to address cancer care challenges. In reaching and serving vulnerable populations by providing targeted cancer prevention care services, including skin cancer screening for children and adults with albinism, and the distribution of sunprotection creams.

- v. **Establish and support** transport mechanisms (health transport funds or "health passports") that enable patients from remote villages to access cancer care and treatment in major health facilities.
- vi. Integration of cancer screening into HIV care by identifying and serving patients living with HIV who are at increased risk of certain cancers, and ensuring they receive early diagnosis and appropriate treatment.
- vii. Strategic Launch: Officially unveil ORCI's Strategic Plan 2026–2030, which aims to reduce cancer mortality in Tanzania by 30% by the year 2030.

- v. Prevention and Early Detection Strategies.
- vi. Oncology Nursing.
- vii. Paediatric Oncology.
- viii. Advancing Cancer Research and Clinical Trials in Africa.
- ix. Bridging Gaps in Access to Cancer Care.
- x. Strengthening Palliative, Survivorship and Supportive Care Services.
- xi. Building Human Resource Capacity in Oncology.
- xii. Community Engagement (Women, Youth, and Grassroots Approaches).
- xiii. Involving Ancillary groups in improving cancer care (Traditional Medicine, Nutritionists, Psychologist, Social Workers, Chaplains, Physiotherapists and Pharmacists).
